CHRISTIAN EDUCATION REPORT

Dreams do come true! For a number of years it has been a dream of mine, and many others, in our congregation, that we would have a new building to enable us to better serve the educational needs of our congregation. A Strategic Planning Ministry team was formed. This group worked long and hard to determine the needs of our congregation. After this group determined what was felt to be the needs of the congregation, a capital campaign was held, a building committee formed and three plus years later we are using our new building.

December 14, 2008~the Sunday School opening was held in the Social Hall of the new building, the two nursery classes occupied their rooms and the senior adults had class in the social hall as they sat on their new chairs which will be moved across the hall into the new senior adult Sunday School classroom as soon as the rest of our furniture arrives. The pre-school children will have two openings on Sunday morning~one in the new building for the two and three year olds and the second in the Kindergarten/Children's Church Room, for the four and five year olds.

The Youth Room (old social hall) has new furniture and other im-

provements are underway. Some work is planned for the library area of this space and the audio-visual library will be moved to this area.

The nursery on the main floor of the educational building has been painted and new tables added. This room is now the Kindergarten Room, which is used for Sunday School for the 4 and 5 year old and Children's Church.

Work is under way in the large classroom at the end of the hall upstairs in the Educational Building~the Young Adult class will move into this room and the present young adult classroom will become a classroom for the "20's Class". The Lectionary Class will be using the new classroom behind the chancel as soon as it is ready!

What a wonderful way to start 2009! Thanks be to GOD for our many blessings! And my heartfelt thanks goes to the membership of Wittenberg for the way they have allowed God to use them in this ministry.

BLESSING OF HOMES

What is an Epiphany Blessing of Home - Chalking the Door?

A short liturgy is used during marking our homes, usually at the main entrance, with sacred signs and symbols as we ask God's blessing upon those who live, work or visit throughout the coming year. We mark our doors with chalk as a sign that we have invited God's presence and blessing into our homes.

We chalk, "Christus Mansionem Benedicat," meaning "May Christ bless this dwelling." These letters inscribed between the numbers of the year of the ceremony. Thus, as people are given the opportunity to participate in the chalking of the door, they will inscribe one or more of the symbols: 20 C M B 09

The Parish Life group would like to organize a Chalking the Door for January 10, 2009 to begin at 4:00 PM at the first home for chalking. Along with the chalking we will have a progressive dinner. Each home to be chanked will prepare one dish that each person in attendance will taste. Who ever is the last to have their door chanked will be the dessert home.
