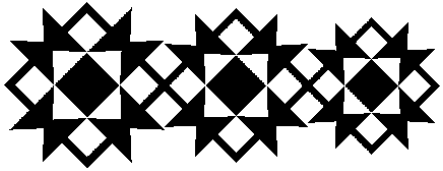

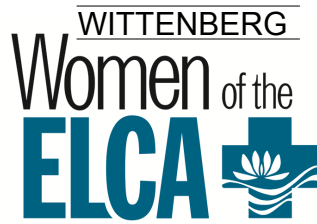

Pastor Sherman gave a brief **devotion** and presented the **Pastor's Report:**

1. The Western District of LMM meeting will be held at Wittenberg on Wednesday, January 12, at 7 p.m.
2. A program, Holy Days of Conversation, will be held at Newberry College on February 6, 2010. This is one of several programs being organized to better inform members of Lutheran churches in this area about the recent actions taken on human sexuality by the ELCA.
3. A request for membership by Jim and Tammy Garrett was approved.
4. Several meetings will be held in the area to present various points of view regarding the human sexuality issue arising from actions taken by the ELCA.
5. A list of Committee Chairs was distributed. A request was made that any motions that might arise in committees be submitted to Council in writing, including the name of persons making the motion as well as the second.

Report of the Executive Committee: There was no report. However, it was announced that the Executive Committee will meet on January 21, 2010, at 7 p.m. at the church.

Treasurer's Report. Brent Shealy distributed the monthly Financial Report. A copy of the complete report is available in the Church Office.

Brent also noted that the Note Payable amount on December 31, 2009, was \$540,000.00.

Brent also stated that contributions for 2009 (vs 2008) were down by approximately \$27,000.00. Brent stated that overall; the financial picture at Wittenberg is "good," especially given the current state of the economy.

MARK THE DATE

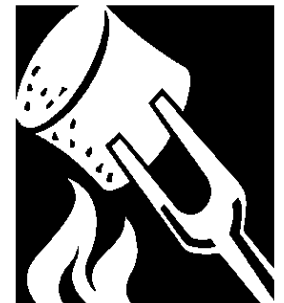

Financial Secretary Report: Connie distributed the December giving report. The total giving was \$51,255.89. The current giving was \$23,035.75 and Building Fund offering was \$26,641.65. The balance consisted of various miscellaneous offerings.

Committee Assignments: Pastor Sherman again called attention to the list of Committee Chairs and asked the chairs either to serve as Chair of the committee or as liaison for the committee if another member is Chair.

Pastor Sherman stated that the **Strategic Planning Committee** should meet. He and Bill Caughman (Chairman of Strategic Planning) will address this matter.

Rebecca suggested that Committee Chairs present committee report once each quarter. This was discussed and agreed upon.

Brent Shealy stated that the contributions to the Food Pantry have exceeded the expenses by almost \$2,000.00. He also stated that the income from the church photos and cards has produced a benefit for the Building Fund of approximately \$500.00.

Brent asked about the status of the "After-School Program." Pastor Sherman stated that the program will begin January 29 with 20 students. They will attend on Mondays and Thursdays. After 6 weeks, the program will be reviewed. Ervin Caughman asked if the program was working with local schools to attempt to operate the program in the schools (where the students are already present).

The meeting was adjourned at 8:05 p.m.
