Pastor's Reflection

Dear Wittenberg,

I once heard an ordination sermon that encouraged the new pastor to remember that ministry is not a microwave. Ministry is a slow cooker. Things take longer than we expect and we don't always get to see the end result.

I've thought about that often in the past decade. Sometimes, the pace of ministry can be really frustrating. The church can seem to be dragging its feet while we're dedicating time to make sure that we have people on board with a new plan or initiative. Outside folks don't always understand why it can take us a few meetings and a month or so to get a contract signed or make a decision about property or curriculum.

Other times, that idea of ministry as a slow cooker can be really helpful. During our recent Vacation Bible School, the adult class broke into song with one of the tunes they had learned at Bible school decades before. At Confirmation Camp, we were able to see the fruits of the years of Christian education. The middle schoolers knew things about covenants and worship and the faithful life. I know from my own experience teaching that students don't always respond during the lesson time. Seeing that all was not lost gives me hope.

Every healthy congregation is always throwing something good in the slow cooker for the next generation. 100 years ago, the Lutherans before us built a sanctuary that inspires our members and visitors alike. 10 years ago, our newest wing made space for Wittenberg's ministries to expand, and particularly to reach out to our neighbors through our Preschool Program and soup kitchen.

Now, we're in a position to prep a good meal for the times to come. We don't know what God has in store for Wittenberg, but we have a good plan to set ourselves up for stability and growth. Vision 20+20 sets financial goals and program goals for the next few years. Our hope and plan for the property is to expand our preschool space, bring our food pantry up to ground level, and make our buildings and grounds ready for what is to come. We know that the stability of Wittenberg's ministry will be blessed by having a large enough cemetery endowment to cover the costs of upkeep. Our endowment makes a bigger impact on our community as it grows each year. We are blessed to be a blessing to the wider community.

Wittenberg is in a strong place. We have buildings and grounds that are welcoming to all. We have leaders and members who are gifted to do the ministry that God is calling us to do. We have a vision for what God is calling us to in the future. And we have the ability to build up this congregation so that the next generation can carry out the ministry that God will call them to in their time.

I'm excited to see what God is going to do through us, with us, and in us.

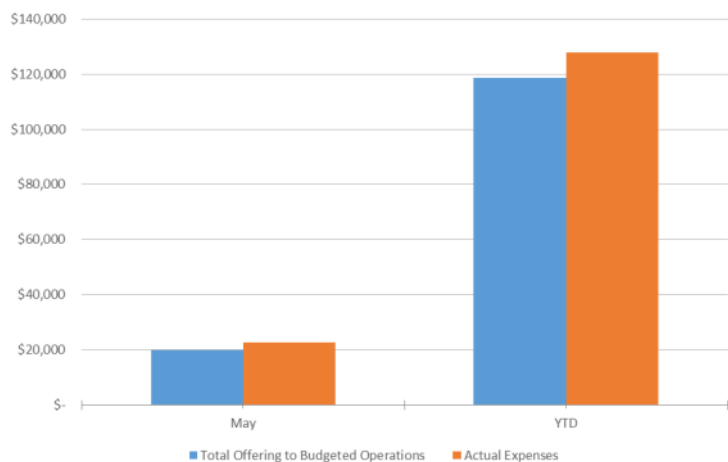

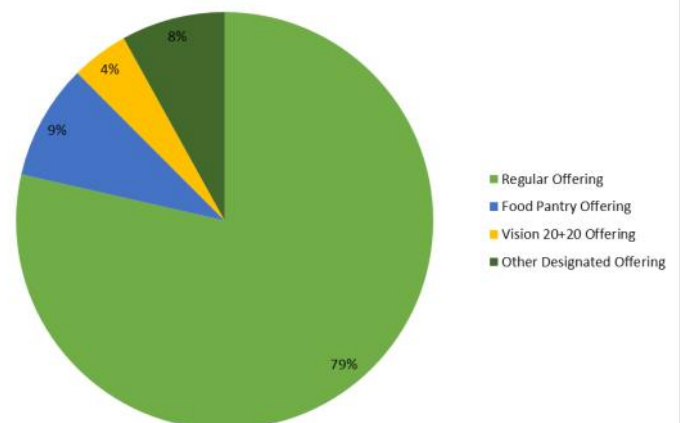

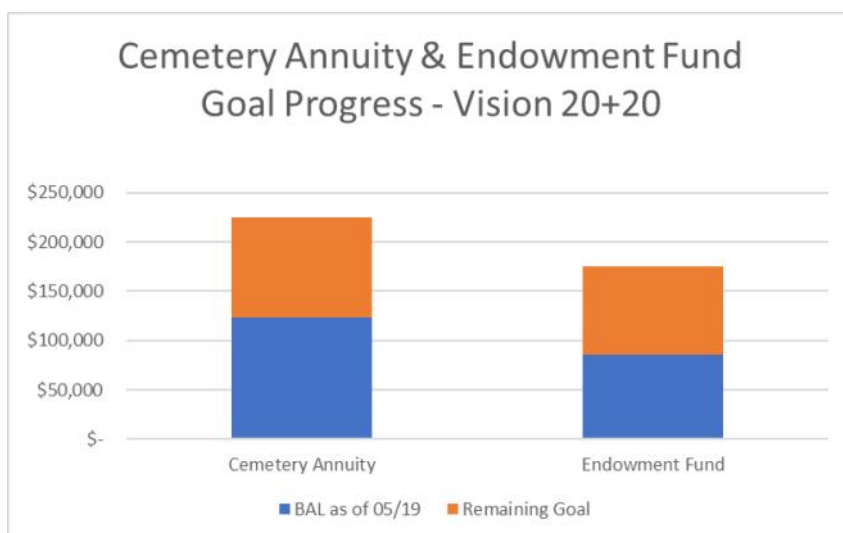

Prior Meeting Minutes (previously approved by email)

Pastor's Report: Printed report supplied by Pastor. Highlights include average weekly attendance January-May, Confirmation Camp 6/16-6/22 (Lutherock), youth trip to New Orleans (supply pastor needed for July 7), upcoming continuing education/churchwide assembly, pastor will be away for 3 Sundays (July 28, Aug 4, Aug 11). Approved after motion from Jay, 2nd from Chip.

Treasurer' Report: Checking acct balance \$25,849.69, of which \$25,332.39 is restricted funds (food pantry, soup kitchen, security camera, food pantry renovation, and reserve for old copier lease). Vision 20+20 balance is approximately \$96,500. Publishing Vision 20+20 intake and disbursements has been discussed. Report approved after motion from Cher, 2nd from Gregg.

Financial Secretary's Report: submitted via email prior to meeting. Approved after motion from Cher, 2nd from Chip.

President's Report:

No current facilities use requests.

Update on 2019 Council Goals: Goal 1 (Billy)- updated property survey is complete, follow up meeting with Craig Otto TBD. Facilities Task Force to meet prior to next meeting with Otto. Goal 2 (Brian) – no update at this time. Goal 3 – 150th Anniversary Celebration planning meeting this Thursday.

Crumley Memorial Scholarship: Approved by Council 1/2017, has yet to be disbursed. Motion to change application dates, just for this year, to July 1-August 31, approved after motion from Jay, 2nd from Chip. Usual application dates are listed in the original document from 2017 Council.

Committee Reports

Cemetery: Sidewalk will be installed as soon as permit is received from the town.

Christian Education: VBS starts 6/23, volunteers working out a schedule for teaching the youth Sunday School class until new Youth Director is in place.

Evangelism & A/V Tech: Tom noted improvements in sound system provided by the purchase of Pastor's new microphone.

Mutual Ministry: No report

Parish Life: No report

Preschool: A preschool parent who works for the Sheriff's department has offered to teach "Active Shooter Preparedness" to staff. Chip will schedule and anyone is welcome to attend this training.

Property: New flooring has been installed in BBW area, Preschool/Senior adult classrooms and hall. AED/CPR certification will be provided by Jay Hendrix, dates TBD. Elevator has been malfunctioning recently. Maintenance contract is up for renewal soon, Jay motioned to terminate service contract with Thyssen Krupp (2nd from Gregg). Motion approved.

Social Ministry: No report

Stewardship & Finance: monthly meeting 6/9/19. Motion to put Youth Director salary into Vision 20+20 until new Youth Director is hired, or until the end of the current budget year. Approved after motion from Billy, 2nd from Chip. 2018 audit is expected to begin next month.

Strategic Planning: met 6/2/19 for quarterly meeting. Plan to keep publicizing what Vision 20+20 is doing (flooring, window shades, etc). Also, based on survey results, a comprehensive security protocol is a priority for the congregation, and the committee would like to move forward with that. Prior quote on security cameras was provided in the past year, will need review and revision. Executive committee, Youth, Christian Education and Preschool need to be involved in this process.

Worship & Music: met 6/3/19. Rebecca Reed will be over OSJ until new Youth Director is hired (with help from Cher Davis and other parent volunteers as needed). Altar Guild meeting/training will be on 6/10/19.

Youth: Chicken plate fundraiser made over \$2000, Cher expressed appreciation to all who helped make that a success. New Orleans trip is on track for July 7-13. Youth beach day scheduled for August 3 (day trip). Job description for Youth Director needs to be finalized so applicant search can begin.

Other New Business: Anytime Fitness holds a yearly 5K and donates profit to a charity. They would like to donate this year's profits to our food pantry. The 5K will be in the fall.

Meeting adjourned at 8:43 p.m. with the Lord's Prayer, after motion from Cher, 2nd from Billy.
