Pastor's Reflection

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"We always thank God for all of you, mentioning you in our prayers. We continually remember before our God and Father your work produced by faith, your labor prompted by love, and your endurance inspired by hope in our Lord Jesus Christ." (1 Thessalonians 1:2-3, NIV)

- Your preschool is providing service to the community by giving our children a safe and welcoming environment so that parents can have peace of mind.
- Plans are coming together for Vacation Bible School.
- The South Carolina Synod is hosting Synod Assembly this month, at which
 we will elect a new bishop, among other agenda items.

This isn't your pastor's work alone, not by a long shot. This is also not a complete list. This is the work of your staff, your leaders, and all of you, the people of God. This has been made possible by your prayers, your time, your thoughtfulness, and your financial gifts to support God's work through Wittenberg Lutheran Church.

I am grateful for the work that I see happening because of you. I thank God for what God is doing with our hands and resources. Thank you for all the ways that you are part of this ministry.



President's Report:

<u>Facility Use Request</u> One formal Facility Use Request for a birthday party was received. After much discussion it was concluded that it would not be prudent to grant facility use requests during this phase of Covid-19. The Congregation will be notified that we will not take applications for facility use until further notice.

<u>Donation</u> Upon motion from the Executive Committee with second by Ricky, Council agreed to donate \$100 to St. James Lutheran in Summit.

<u>Update on Youth Director</u> Upon motion by Chris with second by Todd, Council granted permission to interview two candidates for Youth Director.
