CHILDREN'S SERMON

FIRST READING.....*Exodus 33:12-23*

¹²Moses said to the Lord, "See, you have said to me, 'Bring up this people'; but you have not let me know whom you will send with me. Yet you have said, 'I know you by name, and you have also found favor in my sight.' ¹³Now if I have found favor in your

sight, show me your ways, so that I may know you and find favor in your sight. Consider too that this nation is your people.” ¹⁴The Lord said, “My presence will go with you, and I will give you rest.” ¹⁵And he said to the Lord, “If your presence will not go, do not carry us up from here. ¹⁶For how shall it be known that I have found favor in your sight, I and your people, unless you go with us? In this way, we shall be distinct, I and your people, from every people on the face of the earth.”
