Pastor's Reflection

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We're looking for a few good council members! Each year, Wittenberg's council has four members who rotate off and four members who are newly elected. Council members serve three-year terms, so our twelve-person council always has experienced leaders along with fresh eyes and energy for ministry. This year, we will also be electing one person for a two-year term, to finish out the term vacated by a resignation.

Council is an important part of our life as a congregation. The church council is our board, in a legal sense, and is responsible for working with the pastor to oversee all aspects of what we do together. The council is in one sense the hub of the wheel. Not everything is done by council, but council makes sure that everything we do coordinates together and moves us forward in God's mission for us.

Council members have several roles at Wittenberg. They participate in all called meetings of the church council, which happen monthly and sometimes more often as necessary. They are active in the life of Wittenberg Lutheran Church, participating in church activities and worship. Our council members count the offerings on a rotating basis, working with our Financial Secretary. They also serve as a liaison to one or more committees. Some council liaisons serve as the chair of their committee, where others are not. The role is about helping our whole community to communicate well and carry out the work God is calling us to do.

Some council members are also elected to serve as officers. These include the Council President, Vice President, and Secretary. These officers are elected each year by the new council for a year term in their roles. The council also elects our Financial Secretary and Treasurer, who are present for meetings but not voting members of council.

This year, we are forming a new committee. The Nominating Committee will work and pray together about who God might be calling into leadership in this way. The committee will be made up of Pastor Emily and the four council members who are ending three-year terms. This year, that includes Margaret Caughman, Crissie Kirby, Dean Rodgers, and Brian Shealy. They will invite specific members of the congregation to consider this ministry. This is not a way to limit who might be on the ballot—any confirmed member of Wittenberg is eligible to be elected and welcome to stand for election. It is a way of gathering together to lift up the needs of the congregation well ahead of our annual meeting, so that the Spirit can be deliberately invited into the process.

Please pray for our leaders and for this nominating process. Talk with God about who might serve well on council and whether you might be called to this important ministry. Thank you for all the ways you serve, at Wittenberg and out in the world God loves.

Social Ministry Update

Visiting Angels: What was once Christian Care is now under the umbrella of Social Ministry. Now these men and women are referred to as “Visiting Angels” and they assist the pastor in visiting our many members who are hospitalized, in rehabilitation facilities, nursing homes, or in their own homes as shut-ins. Doris Antley has volunteered to organize this group of “angels” and act as the contact person. These people will bring Sunday bulletins, flowers (that have been left on the altar after the Sunday service), DVDs of the Sunday service, and large print quarterly devotionals to our members who would like to receive them. In cooperation with our local fire department and Jay Hendrix, they will assist with making sure that the homeowners have a working smoke detector in their home. We want our members to be safe and not climbing step stools or ladders to change batteries in their smoke alarms! Pastor Emily is in the process of ordering Communion kits and will train these people to assist in sharing Communion with any member who requests this service. Please be assured that Pastor Emily will continue to visit our shut-ins.

Birthday Cards: Instead of using a “one card fits all” birthday card, we now have cards designed for children, teenagers, women and men. Susan Shealy has organized our volunteers to address these cards on a monthly basis and they are mailed out from the church office weekly. **Please, if you are aware of any errors (spelling, dates, etc.) in our birthday list or anniversary list printed in the newsletter, inform the parish administrator or Susan Shealy so that we can correct our database. We want to keep our membership list as accurate as possible.**

Adopt-A-Highway: Social Ministry is no longer responsible for this activity. The Youth Ministry will be taking over the four collections as a community service project.

Call to Order@ 7:01 p.m. Devotion by Jay Hendrix - Love in Action

Treasurer's Report: There is \$28,989 in the checking account of which \$9,000 is food pantry and soup kitchen designated. Spent \$1,342 on a new office computer and software. \$480 to have the fellowship hall cleaned and buffed. Jay moved to accept and Chrissie seconded. Passed.

Financial Secretary's Report: Was sent out ahead of time. Tom made a motion to accept and Chrissie seconded. Passed.

Pastor's Report: Continues to be busy. Pastoral care - 19, Bible School, attending committee meetings, KICS, Preschool Chapel, toured Camp Kinard with director. Will be attending a class at Luther Seminary on Staff Supervision August 26-28. Has set up a nominating committee for council which consists of the pastor and council members who are going off council this year: Dean Rodgers, Crissie Kirby, Brian Shealy, and Margaret Caughman. There will be an article in the newsletter explaining what is needed.

President's Report: We are in the process of establishing a committee for the 150th Church Anniversary and to date, Ann Nichols has agreed to serve on the committee. The Executive Committee made a motion for the following: Camp and Convention fees for all Wittenberg children and youth are to be reimbursed in the following amounts: Confirmation camp @ 100%, Novus Way @ 50%, Synod led youth events @ 100%. Chip seconded. Passed.

Committee Reports

AV and Technology: No Report

Cemetery: The street right of way has been staked. Greg and Ricky to meet this week to determine if a sidewalk is feasible. Fence probably is on a Sept/Oct timeline. There is a 10 foot boundary to the road.

Christian Education: Bible School was a great success, Rally day is August 29th and the blessing of the backpacks is August 19th.

Endowment: Will meet with financial advisor on \$20,000 money market and \$20,000 bond maturing for his advice.

Evangelism: No Report. Will meet July 22nd.

Mutual Ministry: Next meeting July 26th.

Preschool: Met Thursday night will forward minutes to council. Will have a class on Aug 4th for the staff on Professionalism. Would like to join with Social Ministry in planning some events i.e. Daddy/Daughter Valentine's Day dance, movie night. They are currently looking for storage containers that can be locked. Would like to meet with Property Committee on replacing the carpet in the two classrooms (this will be paid for out of Preschool budget).

Property: Mike Reed gave a rough estimate of \$12,000 to up fit the parsonage garage to use as the Food Pantry. The carpet in the Sanctuary was cleaned after VBS last Thursday. The old chairs in the basement have been sent elsewhere. The Nativity Scene was moved for easier access so it can be refinished. The Christmas tree is still looking for a new storage space. Bus driver training needs to be done. Bus will be serviced tomorrow. The AC has been repaired in the upstairs of the parsonage. The Fire Department will be doing a smoke alarm blitz on August 11th in the Saluda section of Batesburg-Leesville.

Social Ministry: 19 attended the July 1st concert. The following is being planned: day out to Miller's Bread Basket, dinner at Gasthaus Zur Elli in Prosperity, working on a visit to Plains Georgia, starting work on Wittenberg's next pictorial directory.

Strategic Planning: No Report.

Stewardship & Finance: Would like to change 13.06 of the church constitution to change every member visit requirement. They would like to suggest that all committee's look over their own areas to see if any changes are needed.

Worship & Music: The new linens have arrived.

Youth Ministry: Emily Davis and Nevin Rodgers attend the Newberry Youth Gathering. Cher & Pastor will meet to schedule coming events. KICS had an outing today with 10 kids & their families. KICS to work on their schedule for next year. They would like to have a swimming party on Rally Day.

Other Business: Tom Sawyer discussed security issues and how to lock some doors during the 11:00 church service. Doors could be locked by the ushers after the service starts. Mike Sherman suggests we install security cameras as a deterrent. Would like for AV&T to research this further. Noted locks in the old educational building do not have panic mode (panic mode = panic exit device or panic push bar). These need to be changed. Jay will discuss with Ervin Caughman on what needs to be done.

Meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.
