Our new building is a beacon of hope to our community and a witness to Jesus Christ, who said that his body was the Temple of God (John 2:21). Jesus says this because in the person of Jesus Christ is the powerful presence of God. 





### **Approved Council Meeting Minutes, July 14, 2024:**

Members Present: Andrew, Robin, Mike, Ross, Michael, Jarrod, Justin, Debbie, Patricia, Betsy M., and Pastor Andrew call the meeting to order at 7:02pm Wittenberg Memory & Devotion - Justin Trotter shared a memory of first coming to church here with a girl he was dating and how he appreciated how everyone was like family. He read a devotion about loving relationships and how we should love one another as Christ loved Prayer Concerns – Mary Cook, Laurie Boozer, and Tim Watkins.

Pastor's Report for July

June average total was 103 which is down from 106 last month. Commented on how good it was to see younger people participating in worship. Confirmation camp went well. Attendees tackled important questions about faith. On Sept. 15<sup>th</sup> a reunion of the group that went to confirmation camp will be held in Prosperity.

- Commented on the great impact of our outreach and how we are showing our love for other people. It has made an impression on those

who have recently joined in that it shows we are living our faith.

- Pastor will be on vacation July 24-31. Pastor Schafer has confirmed that he will be our pastor for the service on July 28<sup>th</sup>. There will be no coffee and conversation on Monday, July 29<sup>th</sup>.

Ross motioned to accept Pastor's report and Debbie seconded. All were in favor.

V. Treasurer's Report – emailed by Brent.

-Brent reviewed restricted funds report and highlighted that the deficit was better than last month. Discussed the list of significant disbursements (list was forwarded to each council member.) Discussed the amount paid so far to Metro Construction. Reported on how the money from Vision 2020 is moved so that bills can be paid for Food Pantry construction. Explained how the food pantry construction is paid through the operating checking account. The exact amount of money is transferred from the Vision 2020 checking to the operating checking account. Reported that Endowment Fund had another good month. Andrew thanked Brent for all his efforts.

Cemetery: Michael Guerette – Clean up of the cemetery did not happen and will be rescheduled for the fall. Mike replaced trash cans. Michael will take old plastic cans to recycle. The sagging of several plots was explained and the gravedigger for Barr-Price can fix for \$600. Ross made the motion to repair the graves for \$600. Mike seconded. All were in favor. Michael asked about funds for this expense and Brent stated that it would come out of the Cemetery Fund.

Pre-School: Debbie Black- MaryAnn Shealy has met with Vickie Watkins and Brent should be getting financial reports from Vickie. Steve Humphries is the finance person for the pre-school and should be transferring money for investment. Grant money of \$30,000 must be spent by end of September and another grant of \$70,000 is expected. July 31<sup>st</sup> from 6:00 to 6:45 is Parent Open House. August 5<sup>th</sup> the new students will begin. For this coming year there are 9 in 2 year old program, 11 in ¾ year old program, and 17 afterschool students. Committee is in process of reviewing handbooks. MaryAnn will communicate with Property Committee for any needs.

Property: Ross Cary, Mike Nichols – Ross stated that last month the termite bait stations were installed. The amount to fix the 8ft. of sill went from \$75 to \$350 a foot to repair so the repair was not made. Damage does not seem that bad. Michael G. said he would look at it. Mike got bids for water and electric work. He is having trouble getting a second bid for the HVAC. The plumbing has been roughed in and the concrete should be poured in the next week. The walls for bathroom will need to be framed and sheet rocked. They will get a bid from Ben Ruff and prother contractor. The carriet was cleaned in the sanctuary and hallway for a cost of \$2250.
