Greetings, Wittenberg family,

As we have journeyed through these 40 days in the wilderness of Lent, remembering our baptism, and turning away from sin and darkness to light and life, it is finally time to end our fast and begin the great feast of the Pascha, the Passover of our Lord Jesus, Easter.

At Easter, we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord. We rejoice that through his resurrection, we have resurrection. Because he swallowed up death with his death, now death has become, not the end, but the start of a new beginning, in fuller communion with God. In many and various ways, we experience little deaths and little resurrections all the time: the end of one relationship near the birth of another relationship, the end of high school opens up to the new beginning of college or work, college ends and life in the workforce begins, the end of one job opens up opportunity for another job. The birth of a child signals the beginning of parenthood and the end of some of the activities and lifestyles of being a childless couple.

These little deaths and these little resurrections bring with them a mixture of joys and sorrows. And in all of these, we are able to drink our cup of life to the dregs, giving thanks to God for true life in his Son. During hard times and good times, we can rejoice that Christ is with us and in him we will endure, persevere, and conquer the trials and tribulations in our lives.

As we enter into the Easter season, may we spend more time with our crucified and resurrected Lord. We do this through prayer, studying the scripture, receiving the Sacraments in worship, and showing the love of God to our neighbor (especially in Luke-Acts, the greatest indication that one has accepted Jesus and received his Gospel message is one's actions of hospitality to others, including the stranger and foreigner). In these ways, we can recognize Jesus' presence in the many different situations in our life, able to see what part of our lives needs crucifying and which part needs resurrecting, give thanks to our Lord, and progress closer to God.

- You may have noticed that the project to enclose the bus shelter has been completed.

Thanks to Mike Nichols for overseeing this project as part of the Property Committee's area. And big thanks to our ever-helpful resident electricians Todd and Ervin for wiring the building for power (lights and garage door openers).

- You will soon notice some very important "housekeeping" upgrades happening in our church cemetery. We will have a "soft wash" vendor on site in early April working on cleaning approximately 250 headstones that have had moss and lichen growing on them for years. Should be a noticeable improvement when he's finished. Planning is also underway to install a fence down the Frances Street side of the cemetery to help frame the property and keep folks from driving in on that side. Many thanks to Michael Guerette for spearheading both of these projects for us as chair of the Cemetery Committee.

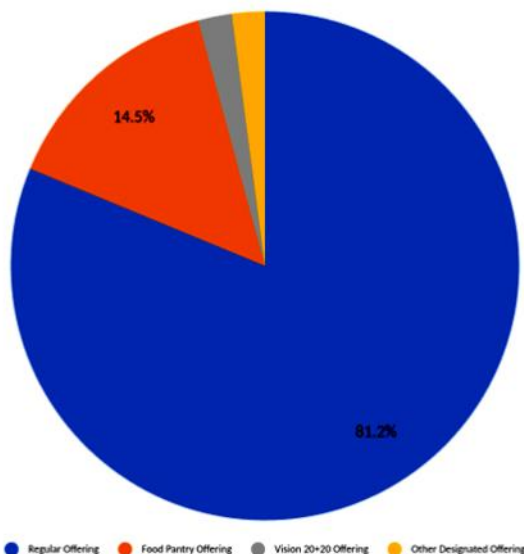

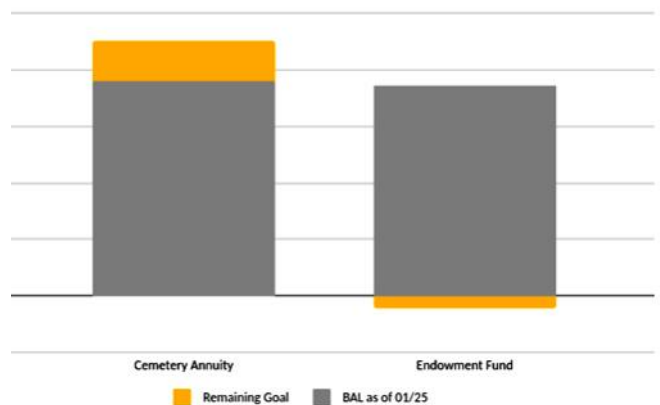

Approved Council Meeting Minutes, March 9, 2025:

Present; Pastor Keith, Andrew Hendrix, Robin Taylor, Mike Nichols, Connie Kramer, Betsy Dority, Taylor Davis, Ricky Frick, Kim Hendrix, Michael Guerette, Patricia Tiffner, Betsy McEwen, Brent Shealy, Debbie Black.

Meeting was called to order at 7:02pm.

Patricia did the devotion, read a passage from Romans 8-28.

Prayer concerns: Stuart and Sandy Rheingold are both recovering from the flu, as well as Harriet Householder. Gay Hartley had emergency liver transplant. Patricia's niece Jamie is currently in rehabilitation.

Pastor's report: attendance is going well; Ash Wednesday had a high turnout 70-80 people; Sunday school has picked up 8-9 people; coffee and conversation has 18-20 people attending. Pastor is still looking for 2 people to attend the Synod Assembly in June this year. Motion to accept report by Debbie and seconded by Mike.

Financial Secretary: Thrivent sent \$102 to the food pantry; Ash Wednesday service collected \$301 for Hurricane relief and received another \$500 from a lunch at Greg Long's on March 9. Motion to accept report by Patricia and seconded by Robin.

Treasurer's Report: Balance in the account is \$48,233, restricted amount is \$26,000, Unrestricted amount is \$22,000+; Had to pay the cost of the Engineering fee for the food pantry building \$3,128.13; Fee for cleaning the floors for the dining hall and kitchen was \$1,765; sent \$5,000 to the Synod. Motion to accept by Betsy McEwen and seconded by Debbie.

President's Report: Harriet Householder has requested to use the facility on 10-19-2025 for the OWL'S luncheon. Thank you to all the service groups for providing meals during the Lent season. Motion to accept by Patricia and seconded by Taylor.

Audio & Visual: Taylor mentioned that she's creating a schedule with the youth to keep the audio and cameras running.

Cemetery Committee: The fence proposal from Bouknight Fence for \$9,000 has been approved; motion to accept by Debbie and seconded by Betsy McEwen; the Headstone cleaning proposal from JR Super wash LLC for \$2,700 has been approved; motion to accept by Ricky and seconded by Mike Nichols.

Christian Education: Betsy McEwen mentioned that there will be Easter egg hunt on Easter Sunday; looking for input for VBS this year; she suggested, option 1: Sunday night only, option 2: Sunday & Monday night, option 3: Sunday, Monday & Tuesday Night 6-8pm; June 1 committee will provide 1st Sunday lunch; June 8 recognize our graduates.

Endowment Committee: Andrew mentioned that 4% amount of \$7,200 in grants to be awarded this year; to be reviewed once applicants have submitted their request; motion to accepted by Andrew and seconded by Debbie.

Evangelism Committee: Mike Nichols said a meal was brought to Harriet Householder; looking to have T-shirts printed for the church.

Mutual Ministry: Betsy Dority mentioned that they met on 2-13-2025 and they set goals for this year to attract more youth members.

Parish Life: Robin mentioned that they are going to the Old McDonald Fish Camp on 3-28-2025.

Preschool: Debbie mentioned that they are looking for someone from the congregation to join their committee, 2 people if possible; Lacye took her staff to the conference; one staff member would like to become a certified teacher; the annual audit is coming up; they received another grant; discussed a tuition increase for the fall classes; they are at full student capacity at the moment.

Property Committee: Mike Nichols mentioned that they installed posts near the office to keep people off the grass; they need to replace 7-8 door mats; A flashing needs to be replaced at the front of the Church. They need to purchase 3 electric garage door openers.

Social Ministry: Kim said they needed additional support with purchasing and stocking groceries in the food pantry; they'll provide first Sunday lunch in September; in February soup kitchen provided 134 meals and food pantry helped 197 families; Robert Epting will provide a list of food needed for the Pantry.

Stewardship & Finance: no report.

Worship & Music: Patricia mentioned that the cross is up; healing service is this coming Wednesday; Easter Lillies are on order; some acolyte robes are getting dirty and need to be cleaned.

Youth Committee: Taylor said that they served 120 plates on Shrove Tuesday and collected \$1,280; they will help in the soup kitchen on March 22, 2025. Motion to accept by Mike Nichols and seconded by Patricia.

New Business: Andrew mentioned creating a committee for the design of a new sign in front of the Church. The meeting was adjourned at 8:20pm with the Lord's prayer.
